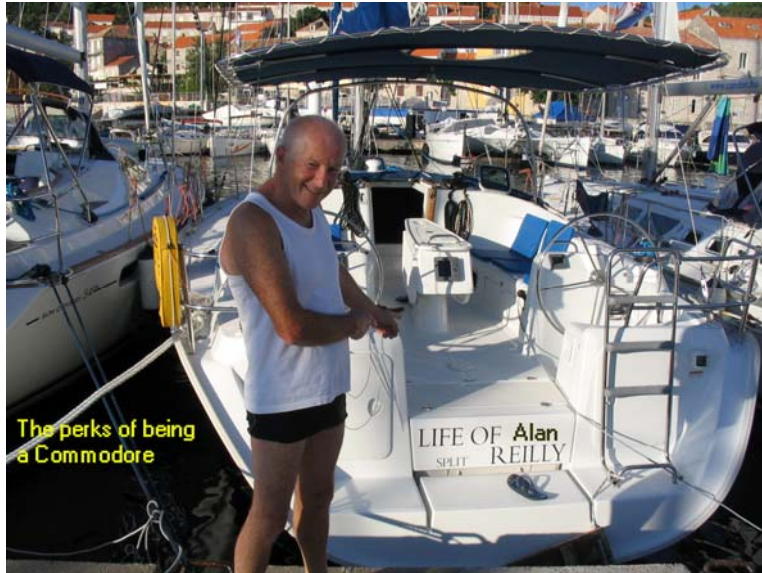


***Message from the Commodore***

Antrim Borough Council's Lough Fest events in August were a huge success, and, thanks to a great number of Club members, three involved boating, sailing or the use of our facilities. We were pleasantly surprised that about 40 visitors turned up for the Try Sailing Night on Wednesday 22 August. In spite of quite a brisk wind they all had an opportunity to go sailing and there were no untoward events! Some were also out on the RIB safety boats and other motorboats as well. Sincere thanks to all of you who turned up to help.

Four of our sailing boats joined the fleet at Kinnegoe on Saturday 25th. to participate in the inaugural Round the Lough Race, a 26 mile circumnavigation of the lough starting and finishing at Kinnegoe and rounding Rams Island. The Antrim boats had been left overnight at Oxford Island allowing the majority of the Antrim crews to arrive for the morning briefing in style,



showing off our new committee boat, *Blue Thunder*, to the envy of the Lough Neagh Boat Club. We acquitted ourselves well in 5 hours of close racing with *Quickflash* getting second place and *Eroica* a very creditable sixth. Three of the fleet sailed home in a fresh north west wind, a long beat to get to the club before the start of the fireworks show, a brilliant and colourful display laid on by the Council with an opening sequence of a large float in the shape of a swan coming down the river triggering a series of pyrotechnics, fire picture and fireworks, a very spectacular end to a long day on the water.

Congratulations to Martin Kidd, whose hard work has been rewarded: Antrim Boat Club is now an RYA Recognised Training Centre (RTC). Training sessions are now well underway and if you are interested in acquiring the Power Boat 2 or any other RYA qualification, please return the enclosed form to Martin ASAP.

Finally, I'm pleased to report that after many months of planning and discussion the long awaited refurbishment of our Club House has been agreed and will start at the beginning of March 2008. We hope to arrange some fund raising events in the autumn to help this project, which I hope you will support.
