Message from the Commodore

A well attended and good natured AGM has started our new year in a spirit of hope and enthusiasm that we can successfully address a number of the challenges facing our Club. I am pleased to have been re-elected Commodore for a second term and want to pay tribute to the out-going Committee for their contributions over the past eventful year. The new Committee (see box below) sees the return of some old faces but also a new one in the form of Geraldine Kelly who has taken on the responsibility of Hon Treasurer, and becomes the second woman on the team. I am also pleased that Firmus Energy has agreed to sponsor us for a further year.

Last year was a mixture of successes and disappointments. We had a number of sailing achievements outside our Club events. In addition to those at Cork week (reported in the last News Sheet), Jeff Harrison, crewed on *Ocean Spirit of Carlingford* which finished 9th of 47 boats, and was 2nd in her class, in the Round Ireland Yacht Race in July, and *Quickflash* (Alfie Mayrs) was first in her class at the Howth Autumn series. Our Open Day on 17 August was very successful and well supported, in spite of the terrible weather, and we had 13 registrants (all of whom went out on a boat of some sort). Thanks to everyone who helped with this, we now have the basis for more regular Open Days in the future. However, the subsequent flooding led to severe damage to our jetties, as seen in the picture, together with the sinking of 3 boats, 2 others being submerged and 2 more badly damaged. We owe a sincere debt of gratitude to Joe Allen and Martin Kidd who were on the scene from the early hours of the morning, and the many others who joined them and worked tirelessly throughout that Sunday to do what they could to limit the damage.



I was also disappointed that we weren't able to agree a Development Plan before the call for bids for an Enhancement grant from the Lough Neagh Partnership was announced. Although the bid we put in for training dinghies was successful, it had to be turned down because of a deep split in the membership over the issue that occurred at the General Meeting to discuss it on 25 September.

So we have a lot of work to do in the year ahead. Our jetties need repaired, the pathways in front of the Clubhouse need resurfacing, there are many calls to electrify the crane, to improve security, and to re-examine the possibility of getting a sailing school started again, to name but a few. What about solar heating? Television in the bar? All this underlines the importance of having an agreed Development Plan that can prioritise these needs and produce a Business Plan to address them.

But we mustn't lose sight of the main purpose of the Club: to help all of us to enjoy our passion for being out on the water!
